

Local Government Benchmarking Data Analysis 13/14 Corporate Performance and Research February 2015


Summary

In line with the ethos of continuous improvement the indicator set has varied slightly from last year and there are currently 8 Pl's relating to educational attainment and Social Care and Housing for which data is yet to be published. It is currently forecast that these will be published in Spring 2015.

Overall East Dunbartonshire is showing an improvement from 12/13 in both performance and Rankings against other Local Authorities.





Absence support and absence improvement across all Directorates remains a key priority for the team and as such performance monitoring, scrutiny, intervention, impact and sustainable improvement remain priority. The need to reduce absence across the Council, report improvement and sustain improved performance will be key messages from the team throughout 2014 in working with Directors, Service Managers and Team Leaders.

Support from the Employee Welfare Team continues with interventions for employees who are at work or are being supported to return to work. The development of the in-house Occupational Health services is in its early stages representing opportunities for increased support, regular appointment schedules and proactive campaigns for areas of concern identified. Continual focus on the need to reduce absence continues to be driven by OC&ER team across the Council with improved reporting, trend analysis, hot spot analysis, intervention approach and impact analysis and current work around benchmarking.

Costs per visit have reduced significantly since 2010/2011. Our service is the smallest of our comparators, which impacts our ability to continue to reduce costs whilst maintaining accredited status.

A number of recent successful funding bids have focussed on audience development work which has led to increased visitor figures in 2014/2015 of around 20% in the year to date. In addition, a new online catalogue will shortly go "live", and will promote our museum services holdings.

Two factors affect the cost both net and gross of waste collection

The first is the service provided and we do provide a higher than most collection service. Our recycling is a two bin system where most Councils have a single bin. The reason for this is to collect a higher quality recycling material which has a higher value this is reflected in the cost of disposal but not collection. We also now collect food waste which many councils have not started, we started early to take advantage of the Zero Waste grants that were available last year to help establish the service.

The second is the operational costs and we are addressing this issue through the shift system which will be implemented in April 2015. This reduces our overheads in respect of overtime and fleet.

While this indicator remains in the bottom quartile it has improved significantly from 12/13. The increase is due to reductions in the number of properties being used for the delivery of services, and the addition of new properties to replace previously poorly performing properties. In addition, capital investment in recent years at Boclair Academy has improved the suitability rating from a "C" to a "B" which has impacted upon the indicator in a positive manner.

The on-line ARC return is in line with the SSHC guidance ie this includes all non-emergency repairs (urgent and routine). The information provided for 13/14 return is not 100% accurate but is the best information available at that time. We have full back up reports to show the calculation workings of what we did submit. To ensure more accurate recording for this indicator, a lot of work has been carried out to devise new internal systems ie new staff structure, mobile technology, schedulers etc. The new systems should be in place to pilot from April 2015. The new mobile technology will ensure that every job is scheduled, appointment made, inspection carried out if required, job completed and recorded within timescales. Training will also be given to Contact Centre staff to ensure appropriate recording categories are made from the outset.

The Council anticipates that there will be minimal improvement in the performance for the 2014/15 year but the 15/16 year should be more accurate. As far as we are aware EDC's local targets are fairly similar to other landlords ie Emergency - 24 hours, urgent 5 days, routine 20 days. As most of our repairs are emergencies (49% compared to an average of other LA landlords of 31%) this also skews the results.

The Council will continue to develop the new IT systems as a matter of urgency. The service is also considering commissioning a consultant during 2015/2016 to carry out a full Audit of the Repairs Service.








- The Cost per Primary School Pupil has decreased against the Scottish Average Since the 2010/11 Baseline











CHN 5 **Sof Pupils Gaining 5+ Awards at Level 6 Performance 47.49% Rank 2 Quartile 1
















The proportion of pupils entering positive destinations has risen significantly from the baseline year and East







The percentage of the highest paid 5% of employees who are women











SW5 Average weekly cost per resident Performance £194.05 Rank 1 Quartile 1






























• Cost of street cleaning has fallen significantly from the baseline year and is now well below the Scottish Average




















 Cost of Environmental Health has decreased since the 2012/13 baseline and is significantly lower than the Scottish average






Waste recycling has increased since the baseline year and is higher than the Scottish average






Percentage of dwellings meeting SHQS Rank 17 Quartile 3














