



#### Introduction

- 1. We are the Boundary Commission for Scotland, an independent, non-political body whose purpose is to make recommendations for UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland.
- 2. We are tasked by the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986 (as amended) to undertake a review of UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland, and we must submit to the Secretary of State for Scotland a report containing our recommendations for 53 Scottish constituencies in September 2018.
- 3. This booklet contains our Revised Proposals for these constituencies and information on how to participate in our public consultation between 17 October 2017 and 11 December 2017.

#### The 2018 Review

- 4. The review which is being conducted simultaneously by the four UK Parliamentary Boundary Commissions, will result in a UK Parliament elected from 600 constituencies in place of the current 650, and in Scotland 53 constituencies in place of the current 59.
  - The legislation defines 2 constituencies in Scotland: Na h-Eileanan an Iar constituency and Orkney and Shetland constituency.
  - The electorate of every other constituency in Scotland must be between 71,031 and 78,507 electors, ie within 5% of the UK-wide electoral quota of 74,769, unless its area exceeds 12,000 square kilometres.
  - No constituency may exceed 13,000 square kilometres.
- 5. In 2013 we stopped work on our previous review of UK Parliament constituencies because Parliament amended the legislation governing it. UK Parliament constituency boundaries have not been reviewed since 2005.
- 6. We commenced the 2018 Review on 24 February 2016. We consulted on our Initial Proposals for a 12 week period from 20 October 2016 to 11 January 2017 and for a further 4 weeks from 28 February until 27 March 2017. We also held 5 Public Hearings in Ayr, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow and Inverness during November and December 2016 which were attended by 81 individuals.
- 7. We have analysed all of the 2,000 comments and feedback from the consultations on our Initial Proposals and have now prepared Revised Proposals for consultation. Details of how to participate in this consultation are given below.
- 8. For each constituency, we must recommend a name and its designation as a burgh constituency or a county constituency.
- 9. For further information on the policies and procedures we have adopted to underpin this review and the legal requirements for constituency design, please refer to our Policies and Procedures booklet, which is available on our website.

#### **Our Revised Proposals**

- 10. We have developed our Revised Proposals using electorate data from 1 December 2015. The number of electors registered in each council electoral ward on that date can be found on our website.
- 11. We took account of the ward boundaries in place from 2007 2017, in line with the legislation within which we work. New wards were introduced from May 2017 and we explored using these during the development of our Revised Proposals, if someone suggested adopting them to improve local ties. However, we did so on the merits of

- their being better indicators of local ties, rather than because they were the boundaries in place for the local government elections on 4th May 2017.
- 12. Where we have had to divide a ward between constituencies we have, in most instances, followed community council area boundaries or other recognisable boundaries. In our Revised Proposals for the 29 mainland council areas there are 297 whole wards and 34 wards divided between constituencies: 42 constituencies contain 1 or more part-wards.
- 13. In our Revised Proposals, 32 of the mainland constituencies are each contained within a single council area and 19 comprise parts of 2 council areas.
- 14. 12 of the mainland constituencies are unchanged from our Initial Proposals.
- 15. One mainland constituency remains unchanged from the existing constituencies: East Lothian.
- 16. Seven constituencies from our Initial Proposals have only their name amended, 11 constituencies have only their boundaries amended and 21 constituencies have both amended boundaries and names.
- 17. Our Revised Proposals are summarised in Table 1, which also indicates the nature of any change we have made since the Initial Proposals. Maps of each constituency can be found in Appendix A. The proposed constituencies and their constituent wards in each council area are listed in Appendix B. A map showing the differences between our Initial Proposals and Revised Proposals can viewed in Appendix C.

#### Public consultation on our Revised Proposals

- 18. The public consultation on our Revised Proposals runs from 17 October 2017 until 11 December 2017. During the consultation period we display our proposals at Display Points, where members of the public can inspect them and find out how to participate in the consultation. There is at least one Display Point in each proposed constituency; details of the nearest Display Point to you are available on our website. Display materials are also available to view on our website.
- 19. There are a range of ways to tell us what you think of our proposals: by leaving a comment on our interactive consultation portal, by email or by writing. Our portal allows you to view the boundaries of our Revised Proposals and search constituencies by postcode or council area. You can also compare our Revised Proposals with our Initial Proposals and the existing constituency boundaries, as well as other boundaries. Maps of each constituency and further information will also be available to download. The consultation portal can be viewed here: www.bcs2018.org.uk.
- 20.All of the comments received during the consultations on our Initial Proposals are available to view on the consultation portal.
- 21. We welcome all comments on our Revised Proposals, whether in support or not, to help inform our deliberations. Comments can be made in the following ways:

weighted by the quality of argument and the evidence provided. We do not accept comments via social media.


#### **Further stages**


# Aberdeen North burgh constituency 77,677 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Aberdeen City wards 1 - 6, part of ward 7 (Midstocket / Rosemount), where the boundary partly follows an historic ward boundary, a ward boundary from 2017 and Westburn Road; and part of Aberdeenshire ward 8 (Mid Formartine) where the boundary follows an historic ward boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed at Rosemount in Aberdeen and includes the Aberdeenshire communities of Balmedie, Belhelvie and Potterton. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




# Aberdeen South burgh constituency 77,106 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Aberdeen City wards 8 – 13, part of ward 7 (Midstocket / Rosemount), where the boundary partly follows an historic ward boundary, a ward boundary from 2017 and Westburn Road; and part of Aberdeenshire ward 18 (Stonehaven and Lower Deeside) where the boundary follows the River Dee and an historic constituency boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed at Rosemount in Aberdeen and includes the Aberdeenshire community of Drumoak. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.



# Angus South and Dundee East county constituency 71,383 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Angus wards 4 – 5, part of ward 1 (Kirriemuir and Dean), ward 6 (Arbroath West and Letham), ward 7 (Arbroath East and Lunan) where the boundary follows historic ward boundaries, ward boundaries from 2017 and a polling district boundary; and Dundee City wards 6 and 8. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency combines parts of Angus Glens and Dundee East constituency and Kincardine and Angus East constituency and has been renamed.




#### Argyll, Bute and Lochaber county constituency 77,661 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Argyll and Bute council area; part of Highland ward 12 (Caol and Mallaig) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary; and Highland ward 22. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed to the north of Loch Eil and by Mallaig. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.



### Arran and Cunninghame county constituency 74,566 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: North Ayrshire wards 1 - 5 and part of ward 6 (Dalry and West Kilbride), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is unchanged. The constituency name is changed from Cunninghame West.




# Ayr and Carrick county constituency 77,352 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: South Ayrshire wards 1 - 5, 7 and 8. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




# Banff and Buchan county constituency 78,079 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Aberdeenshire wards 1-7, 9 and part of ward 8 (Mid Formartine) where the boundary follows the River Ythan. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Newburgh and Methlick. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




### Berwickshire, Roxburgh and Selkirk county constituency 73,812 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Scottish Borders wards 3 – 11 and part of ward 2 (Tweeddale East) where the boundary partly follows a community council area boundary and an historic ward boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed at Cardrona. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




# Clackmannanshire and Dunfermline county constituency 75,735 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Clackmannanshire council area; and Fife wards 1 – 3. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency combines parts of: Clackmannanshire and Stirling North constituency; and Dunfermline constituency and has been renamed.




# Dumfriesshire and Lanarkshire South East county constituency 78,301 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Dumfries and Galloway council area wards 11 - 13, part of ward 8 (Mid and Upper Nithsdale) and ward 9 (Lochar) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries; and South Lanarkshire council area wards 1 - 3, and part of ward 4 (Clydesdale South) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Dumfries and Annandale. The constituency name is changed from Clydesdale and Eskdale.




# **Dunbartonshire East county constituency** 76,393 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: East Dunbartonshire wards 1, 3 - 8 and part of ward 2 (Bearsden North) where the boundary follows Drymen Road and Stockiemuir Road. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Bearsden and Craigton (north of Milngavie). The constituency name is changed from Milngavie and Kirkintilloch.




# **Dunbartonshire West county constituency** 72,459 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: West Dunbartonshire council area and part of East Dunbartonshire ward 2 (Bearsden North) where the boundary follows Drymen Road and Stockiemuir Road. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Bearsden and Craigton (north of Milngavie). The constituency name is changed from West Dunbartonshire and Bearsden North.




# **Dundee burgh constituency** 76,317 electors

The proposed constituency comprises Dundee City council area wards 1-5 and 7. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




# East Lothian county constituency 76,153 electors

The proposed constituency comprises all of East Lothian council area. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




### Eastwood and Loudoun county constituency 71,251 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: East Ayrshire council area ward 1 and part of ward 6 (Irvine Valley) where the boundary follows a railway line; and East Renfrewshire wards 3 – 6 and part of ward 1 (Neilston, Uplawmoor and Newton Mearns North) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is unchanged. The constituency name is changed from Cunninghame East.




### Edinburgh East burgh constituency 74,455 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: City of Edinburgh council area wards 11, 14 and 16 - 17. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by the city centre and Newington. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




# Edinburgh North and Leith burgh constituency 71,541 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: City of Edinburgh council area wards 4, 12 - 13 and part of ward 5 (Inverleith) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and rear fences of properties. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




## Edinburgh Pentland and Livingston county constituency 78,164 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: City of Edinburgh council area wards 2 and part of ward 7 (Sighthill/Gorgie) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary; and West Lothian council area wards 3 – 5 and part of ward 6 (Fauldhouse and Breich Valley) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




### Edinburgh Southside burgh constituency 76,583 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: City of Edinburgh council area wards 8 - 10 and 15. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by the city centre and Newington. The constituency name is changed from Edinburgh South West and Central.




## Edinburgh West burgh constituency 77,738 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: City of Edinburgh council area wards 1, 3 and 6; and part of ward 5 (Inverleith) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and rear fences of properties and ward 7 (Sighthill/Gorgie) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




# Falkirk South county constituency 71,118 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Falkirk council area wards 1-2, 6, 8-9 and part of ward 7 (Falkirk South) where the boundary partly follows a canal, an historic ward boundary and ward boundary from 2017. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Camelon and Skinflats. The constituency name is changed from Falkirk.




# Fife South county constituency 77,327 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Fife council area wards 4 – 9 and part of ward 10 (Burntisland, Kinghorn and Western Kirkcaldy) where the boundary partly follows an historic ward boundary, the Tiel Burn and a railway line. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency combines parts of Dunfermline constituency and Kinross-shire and Cowdenbeath constituency and has been renamed.




# Galloway and Dumfries county constituency 74,882 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Dumfries and Galloway council area wards 1–7 and 10, part of ward 8 (Mid and Upper Nithsdale) and ward 9 (Lochar) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Dumfries and Annandale. The constituency name is changed from Dumfries and Galloway.




### Glasgow Central burgh constituency 73,735 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Glasgow City council area ward 11; and part of ward 5 (Govan), ward 10 (Anderston/ City), ward 12 (Partick West) and ward 15 (Maryhill/ Kelvin) where the boundary largely follow community council area boundaries. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Bellahouston Park and Kelvinside. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




## Glasgow East burgh constituency 75,433 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Glasgow City council area wards 9, 19 - 20 and part of ward 18 (East Centre) where the boundary partly follows a community council area boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




## Glasgow North East burgh constituency 71,443 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Glasgow City council area wards 16 – 17, 21 and part of ward 10 (Anderston/City) where the boundary follows a main road, and ward 18 (East Centre) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is unchanged. The constituency name is changed from Glasgow North.




# Glasgow North West burgh constituency 75,983 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Glasgow City council area wards 13 – 14; and part of ward 12 (Partick West) and ward 15 (Maryhill/ Kelvin) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Kelvinside. The constituency name is changed from Glasgow West.




# Glasgow South East burgh constituency 73,621 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Glasgow City council area wards 1, 7 - 8; and part of ward 2 (Newlands/ Auldburn) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Cathcart and Shawlands. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




# Glasgow South West burgh constituency 76,138 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Glasgow City council area wards 3 – 4, 6; and part of ward 2 (Newlands/ Auldburn) and ward 5 (Govan), where the boundary largely follows community council area boundaries. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Bellahouston Park, Cathcart and Shawlands. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




# Gordon and Deeside county constituency 78,028 electors

The proposed constituency comprises: Aberdeenshire council area wards 10 - 16; and part of ward 8 (Mid Formartine) where the boundary follows an historic ward boundary and the River Ythan. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed by Banchory, Methlick and Balmedie. The constituency name is unchanged from our Initial Proposals.




# Highland North county constituency 73,147 electors

The proposed constituency boundary comprises: Highland council area wards 1 - 5, 7 - 10; and part of ward 6 (Wester Ross, Strathpeffer and Lochalsh) and ward 13 (Aird and Loch Ness) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries and physical features. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




# Highland South county constituency 78,133 electors

The proposed constituency boundary comprises: Highland council area wards 11, 14 – 18, 20, 21; and part of ward 6 (Wester Ross, Strathpeffer and Lochalsh), ward 12 (Caol and Mallaig) and ward 13 (Aird and Loch Ness) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries and physical features. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed to the north of Loch Eil and by Mallaig. The constituency name is changed from Inverness and Skye.




# Inverclyde and Erskine county constituency 77,184 electors

The proposed constituency boundary comprises: Inverclyde council area; and Renfrewshire council area ward 10 and part of ward 11 (Erskine and Inchinnan) where the boundary partly follows a community council area boundary and an historic ward boundary. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary is changed at Bishopton, Erskine and Largs. The constituency name is changed from Inverclyde.




# Kilmarnock, Cumnock and Doon Valley county constituency 78,431 electors

The proposed constituency boundary comprises: East Ayrshire council area wards 2 - 5, 7 - 9 and part of ward 6 (Irvine Valley) where the boundary follows a railway line; and South Ayrshire ward 6. From our Initial Proposals, the constituency boundary and name are unchanged.




### Kincardine and Angus North county constituency 73,849 electors
